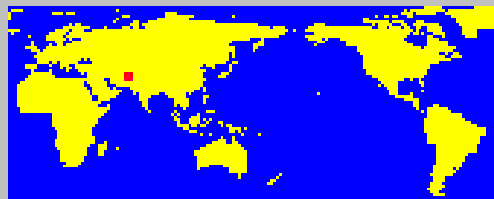

Eid al-Fitr and Eid al-Adha may last up to several days, depending on the region.
